



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIORS

All Juniors should ensure they are fully conversant with this code and should strive to meet the code at all times.

- Treat all other golfers, whether adult or junior with the same respect and fairness you would like them to show you;
- Demonstrate fair play on and off the course. Respect differences in gender, disability, culture, race, ethnicity and religious beliefs between yourself and others;
- Challenge discrimination and prejudice;
- Look out for yourself and the welfare of others;
- Do not engage in any irresponsible, abusive, inappropriate or illegal behaviour;
- Challenge behaviour that falls below the expected standards of the club;
- Speak out if you are concerned about anything, your own needs or the needs of others;
- Be organised and on time;
- Always have the correct equipment when competing i.e. pencil, ball marker, pitch mark repairer, tees etc
- Do not leave the club following a coaching session, match or competition without the knowledge and permission of the Junior Organiser or person in charge;
- Follow the club rules and dress codes;
- You should not:
 - Consume alcohol or illegal and performance enhancing drugs
 - Use foul language
 - Engage in sexual behaviour
 - Gamble

Dress Code

Clubhouse, Golf Course and Practice Area

- Tracksuit tops or bottoms, jeans and other denim clothing, t-shirts, training shoes; cargo shorts/trousers with large exterior pockets should not be worn.
- You should always wear socks and shoes.
- Shorts should be tailored and around knee length. When wearing shorts, you should wear knee length socks or white sports socks.
- Shirts should be tucked into trousers and shorts.

Lounges

- Outer wear such as golf shoes, waterproof golf clothing, top coats, anoraks, windproof clothing and caps should not be worn in the lounges and should be left in the locker rooms

Car Park

- You should change golf shoes and clothing in the locker room and not in the car park.
