



JUNIOR MEMBERS RULES

- 1) Juniors are responsible for ensuring they are aware of the policies and procedures of Northumberland Golf Club and should help in their implementation at all times
- 2) Juniors may use all parts of the clubhouse if appropriately dressed according to club rules. Non alcoholic drinks and food may be purchased from the bar.
- 3) Juniors without an official handicap may play the course only when accompanied by a playing member holding an official handicap in accordance with the club rules.
- 4) Juniors with an official handicap may play the course on their own.
- 5) With the prior permission of the Club Secretary, juniors with an official handicap may introduce a friend under 18 who also must have an official handicap, after payment of the relevant green fee.
- 6) Once an official club handicap has been achieved juniors may play in NGC and GPLGC competitions providing they are accompanied by a full member and have paid the entry fee. They are eligible to win the trophy and/or prize.
- 7) On the golf course dress must be in accordance with the standards appropriate to full members having due regard for age. If in doubt consult the Club Secretary.
- 8) No Junior Member shall invite a guest onto the course other than for the purpose of playing golf and similarly into the clubhouse other than after playing golf.
- 9) All Juniors are expected to conduct themselves with courtesy and good manners on the golf course and in the clubhouse.
- 10) When waiting to be collected after playing golf, Juniors should wait in the clubhouse unless accompanied by an adult.
- 11) The rules of golf are very precise and should be read, understood and complied with. No one knows them all so please obtain a copy from the Secretary.

Remember:

Golf can be a dangerous game. Ensure that you do not strike your ball if you think that your shot could hit anyone in sight: wait until they are well out of range.

On the practice ground the same applies. Do not stand in front of someone in case they hit you with ball, or stand within club swinging range.

If you have a mobile phone take it on to the course making sure it is switched off. It can be used in case of emergency only.
